- Embedding values of respect, honesty, and integrity in everyday school life, promoting mutual respect and tolerance.

5. Social Development

Social development is about students' ability to work well with others, develop positive relationships, and become active members of their community.

At **Illuminate You**, we foster a sense of belonging and collaboration through both academic and non-academic experiences.

Our Approach:

- Promoting teamwork and communication skills through group projects,
